Work shoes or boots with hard sole or anti-slip properties (steel toes may be required-refer to <b>Provided by Contestant</b> section below). Clothing should be as such that it will not get caught in moving equipment or power tools. School uniforms may be worn if they meet the above requirements with all identifiers covered.  **Safety glasses with side shields or goggles (Prescription glasses can be
Testing	<ul> <li>used only if they are equipped with side shields. If not, they must be covered with goggles).</li> <li>Students should be prepared to take a written knowledge test.</li> <li>Students should be prepared for a written SkillsUSA knowledge test. (Provided to all contestants)</li> </ul>
Provided by Contestant (Tool List)	<ul> <li>The SkillsUSA emergency medical form signed by a parent or guardian is required for participation. The contestant must carry the form in their contestant badge holder throughout the competition.</li> <li>Resumes are required and will be checked at registration and in the interview.</li> <li>Each contestant will supply his/her own tools, safety equipment, pen and pencil.</li> <li>Use of any personal special tools will be determined by the judge to assure fairness of the competition.</li> <li>Reference materials such as the AC43.13-1B, Aviation Mechanic's Handbook and Textbooks can be used at Skills Workstations</li> </ul>
