Eligibility	<ul> <li>Leadership and Occupationally Related Contest Specifications - The following competitions are open to all members of SkillsUSA Schools may send one competitor or team for every 500 SkillsUSA members based on local competition.</li> <li>REGIONAL QUALIFIER - ONLY THE TOP 3 (THREE) FROM REGIONAL COMPETITION PROCEED TO STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS</li> </ul>
Clothing	Work/School Attire:  School uniform with all identifying logos/markers covered. Field specific work clothing required for the work environment or that matches the service conditions for the contest. This may include jeans if they are clean and professional looking and are accepted in the respective field (no holes or overly soiled pants). Work shoes or boots with hard sole or anti-slip properties (steel toes may be required-refer to <b>Provided by Contestant</b> section below). Clothing should be as such that it will not get caught in moving equipment or power tools. School uniforms may be worn if they meet the above requirements with all identifiers covered.
Testing	<ul> <li>Students should be prepared to take a written knowledge test for this contest.</li> <li>Students should also be prepared to take a SkillsUSA written knowledge test (Required for all contestants prior to contest day).</li> </ul>
Provided by Contestant (Tool List)	<ul> <li>Copy of current CPR/AED two-man system and first and from any of the following American Red Cross, American Heart Association, American Health and Safety Institute or National Safety</li> <li>Face mask</li> <li>Hard copy of a 1-page personal resume</li> </ul>
Special Notes	<ul> <li>Exhibit Halls do not open to observers until 12:00 pm.</li> <li>No smart watches, earbuds and/or phones are permitted during the contest and/or in the contest</li> </ul>

National Technical Standards	<ul> <li>No contact with anyone outside of the contest area once the contest begins</li> <li>No inappropriate communication between contestants such as verbally degrading another contestant</li> <li>No cheating on any portion of the contest such as informing another contestant of the skills/test prior to competing.</li> <li>Please refer to the 2022-2023 National Technical Standards for all contests. All standards included may be tested in any competition.</li> <li>In conjunction with National Standards, violations may result in student loss of contest.</li> </ul>
Resume	<ul> <li>All SkillsUSA Ohio State Championship Contest will require a short interview component. Students should be prepared with basic job interview skills.</li> <li>All contestants must have a hard copy of a one (1) page personal resume.</li> </ul>
