Purpose: To evaluate a contestant's creative, technical, and oral presentation skills and to recognize outstanding students for excellence and professionalism.

Eligibility	 Please refer to the National Technical Standards for this contest. This competition may send one competitor or team for every 250 SkillsUSA members based on local competition.
Clothing	Official Dress: Official SkillsUSA red blazer, white shirt, black pants or skirt, and black dress shoes. Black socks must be worn with pants and nylons must be worn with a skirt (either skin-tone or black). Males must wear a black tie.
Testing	 Students should be prepared to take a SkillsUSA written knowledge test (Required for all contestants prior to contest day)
Provided by Contestant (Tool List)	 Documentation Hard copy of a one (1) page personal resume Personal Tools 5 copies of pin design rendering on a single 8.5" x 11" page. Both 7" and 1" pin sizes are presented on one side of the page Tabletop display to promote your pin design to the public. Display can be used in the presentation if desired. Displays must fit in an 18"x 24" space Means of presentation: computer, tablet, notebook, poster/display, or other media of your choice if desired to make your presentation to the judges. The tabletop display may be used in your presentation if desired. Due to time constraints on our presentation schedule, projectors/screens will not be used.
Special Notes	 This contest is CLOSED to observers. During orientation, students will be given a time for their presentation. Contestants will be permitted into the contest area at 10:00 a.m. and are encouraged to set up their display. Only contestants are allowed in the presentation areas during the contest. Additional time will be allotted after the orientation meeting for set-up of the tabletop display if needed.

	 No cheating on any portion of the contest such as informing another contestant of the skills/test prior to competing.

Resume	 All SkillsUSA Ohio State Championship Contest will require a short interview component. Students should be prepared with basic job interview skills.
